Together With God

For we are co-workers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building. 1 Corinthians 3:9 NIV

Last year as our Gary Church staff gathered to plan for the year, we participated in a retreat. During our time together we opened our hearts and minds to God leading as we considered our theme for the year. Due to COVID our planning time this year took place through video conferencing. I believe God's Spirit was no less present simply because we were not in the same room, sharing the same physical space.

During our time together things began to crystallize and our theme for this year at Gary Church is "Together with God." Even though we were apart from one another physically, I believe we experience both a sense of togetherness with one another and a sense of togetherness with God. Our theme is based on 1 Corinthians 3. In this chapter Paul addresses the early Christian community in Corinth who had begun to play their own version of "the name game." It was not the silly, yet fun, game that some of us grew up playing where we created a rhyme by changing the first letter of our name. Their name game was much more harmful. It was harmful to their spiritual growth, it was harmful to their unity, and it was harmful to their ultimate purpose and calling.

These Christians had begun to identify themselves with personalities, saying, "I belong to Paul," and another, "I belong to Apollos."

TOGETHER WITH GOD

TOGETHER WITH GOD

Paul addressed this by stating that when they identify themselves this way, as if they were a part of a cult of personality, they are not being spiritual but behaving according to human inclinations. He then reminded them that both he and Apollos are servants of God, coworkers with a common purpose. Individually, they may plant the seeds of faith and nurture faith in people; however it is God who causes people to grow in faith.

From the first chapters of scriptures, God has chosen to work in and through people. In Genesis we read, "God blessed them and said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply." God calls us to bear fruit, to increase in number, to multiply—not to divide. We are coworkers with one another as we allow ourselves to be used by God.

Paul further reminds them and us to not boast about human leaders because all things are ours, not only the apostles and the past, but the present and the future. All belong to us, we belong to Christ, Christ belongs to God (3:23).

In the coming year we will explore ways that we too are being called by God to be servants working for a common purpose. Together, with God, let us set our minds, our hearts, and our hands to fulfilling the purpose to which we have been called. Let us make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.





Wednesday, September 30, 7 p.m. led by Jennifer Castino on Zoom



Thursdays, starting October 1 10 a.m. in the Commons





A New Look at Gary Preschool

Gary Preschool will be open for our new school year beginning September 8. It will be an exciting and challenging time! We will be following the guidelines outlined by the Department of Children and Family Services, the County Health Department, and the state of Illinois.

Before the children and parents enter the building, we will check everyone's temperature, as well as administer a health survey that will screen students for possible health issues related to COVID-19. Our teachers will wear masks throughout the day and encourage our students to wear a mask in the classroom. Daily activities will be organized to keep as much distance as possible while still allowing the children to interact in free play. We will spend as much time as possible playing outside on days when the weather cooperates.

Gary Preschool's mission has always been to encourage growth in all areas of a child's life. Although we are facing some new challenges as we head back to school, we hope to know that behind the masks are great big smiles.

One of our greatest challenges is in regard to our budget. Because our enrollment is lower this year due to uncertainty in sending the children to school, we are facing a deficit in income from tuition. There are a couple ways our Gary friends can help: If you know of anyone who is looking for a preschool home, we would be grateful for your recommendation of Gary Preschool. Gary Youth This Fall

At Gary Church, we believe that Christian education is a high priority for all of us children, youth, and adults alike. Even as we face the difficulties of gathering in person during the pandemic, we want to provide every opportunity for our youth to grow in love for one another and God. We also recognize that we must do all we can while, first, doing no harm. Holding these in tension, we have made the following decisions for the rest of 2020.

1. No Sunday School

There will be no 10 a.m. Sunday School. All youth Christian education will be rolled into the weekly Gary Youth program.

2. Weekly Zoom Meetings

We will keep the Sunday night (high school) and Wednesday night (middle school) format. Over Zoom, we will play games, have discussions together, and pray for one another.

3. Monthly Events

To provide an opportunity for our youth to occasionally get together in person, we have planned monthly gatherings including Unboxing, Halloween, and Painting parties. We will follow all Health Team guidelines and sign-ups will be required.

4. Curriculum

This year we will be using the *Re:Form* curriculum by Sparkhouse. *Re:Form* provides funny animated short videos that will make youth laugh while presenting solid theology. The youth will choose the topics we will be learning during the kick-off party. Some of the lessons include:

- "Who wrote the Bible, God or humans?"
- "Is God male?"
- "Why should I pray if God doesn't answer all my prayers?"
- "Can I be Christian without going to church?"
- "Is it okay to be angry with God?"
- "Can you accept the theory of evolution and still be a Christian?"

Successful Youth Mission Days

Before the COVID-19 pandemic, students and adults from our church planned to go to the Dominican Republic with Christ in Youth ministry for an international mission trip. When our plans were cancelled, we were very disappointed. However, we took the opportunity to turn our attention closer to home. We asked, "Who are the most vulnerable?"

We decided to partner with our friends from ChildServ, now called Kids Above All (KAA), whose mission is to protect, heal, and educate children and families so they can build better lives. From Tuesday, July 28 through Thursday, July 30, twenty-one of our middle school and high school youth gathered in our parking lot. While wearing our masks and social distancing, we tackled several projects as a team. One big job we had was to beautify our church gardens. We weeded, trimmed bushes, poured soil, and mulched. We also had a few painting projects around the building. It was very hot working in the sun, but we kept our cool. We even wrote "we miss you" cards to our elderly church members.

Ed Williams introduced us to his poodle, Mango, whom he takes on visits to KAA group homes. Catherine Inserra and Lily Stamper, from KAA, came to teach us how to make hand-made Grateful Dead t-shirt face masks. The rock band's merchandise from their cancelled concerts was donated to KAA so that we can make face masks for families in need. We made 98 masks! KAA also asked for help in collecting school supplies. We decided to ask our generous neighbors around the church for help, and they really came through. Believe it or not, we collected over \$1,100 worth of school supplies!

Throughout the week, we learned that if we want to grow in our ability to love others more fully, we can follow three simple rules. First, we must do no harm. Secondly, we must do all the good we can. Finally, we must stay in love with God.











Thank you so much to everyone who donated time, money, and prayers, which have given our youth the opportunity to see that they are not just the leaders of tomorrow but the leaders of today.

Please Scream Inside Your Heart

The Fuji-Q Highland amusement park in Japan has a new guideline for roller coaster riders: "Please scream inside your heart!" Our Bell Directors have been carefully watching the recommendations for gatherings and the guidelines from Gary's Health Committee. Based on that information, here are the plans for each of the Gary Handbell Ensembles as we start back to in-person worship in September:

Of course, these plans are subject to revision! We look forward to sharing our gift of music with you in worship either in person or online.



Return to In-Person Worship

Beginning Sunday, September 13, we will have one in-person worship service at 9 a.m. To keep those who attend as safe as possible we will limit the service to 50 pre-registered participants. Please carefully read these guidelines to determine if you will attend or if you will continue to worship at home. If you are in a vulnerable population, we encourage you to watch the service at home. It will be live streamed at 9 a.m. and will be captured, edited, and uploaded for viewing soon after.

Before Attending

- Advanced registration is required at garychurch.org. If you are unable to access the link or have questions, contact the Church Office at 630-668-3100.
- The registration form will include screening questions relating to COVID-19.
- If on the day of the worship service you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, you should remain at home.
- Those returning from travel to any of the CDC identified states with elevated COVID-19 positivity rates should stay home for at least 14 days.
- Bring your mask and be prepared to wear it from the time you exit your car. We will have extra masks available.
- Plan to arrive during the registration period of 8:40–9 a.m. At 9 a.m., the outer doors will be closed and locked.

Upon Arrival

- Only door #5 (off west parking lot) will be open. There you will be welcomed by Greeters and Safety Hosts.
- Before leaving your car, put on your mask. Maintain a six-foot distance from others as you walk to the Safety Hosts' table, near the west doors.
- The Safety Host will take your temperature with an instant-read thermometer briefly pointed at your forehead. Your temperature must be below 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit to enter the building.
- The Safety Host will also provide hand sanitizer and a mask if you forgot yours and will direct you to the Greeter just inside the door.
- The Greeter will check your name off the registration list and invite you to go up the stairs toward the Sanctuary.
- Inside the Sanctuary, an usher will take your name and lead you to the seat you have been assigned, safely distanced from others.
- If at any point in this process there is a line, please maintain a six-foot distance from others.
- All exterior doors will be propped open before and after the service.

Return to In-Person Worship

Safety Protocols During Worship

- Doors to the Sanctuary will remain open.
- Worship services will be no longer than 40 minutes.
- Information will be on our new Sanctuary screens since we are unable to use bulletins, hymnals, and Bibles.
- Verbal greetings and other non-contact greetings will replace shaking hands, hugging, or other physical contact.
- Instrumental music as well as new ways to corporately participate with the music will take the place of congregational singing.
- An offering plate on the Welcome Desk or giving electronically at garychurch.org/giving will replace passing the offering plate.
- We will still have a Children's Time which all will be able to see on the Sanctuary screens from the pews, although we will be unable to offer Kids' Church and activity bags.
- Only the Sound Team will be allowed to enter the balcony where the new A/V desk is located.
- Keep personal items with you rather than using coat racks, etc.
- After the service, ushers will dismiss the congregation by rows.
- Upon dismissal, exit the building using the west or Seminary Street doors as directed by the ushers.

Miscellaneous

- Beverages and refreshments will not be offered and there should be no shared food.
- Restrooms will be available, with entrance doors to bathrooms propped open, where privacy allows. Bathroom surfaces will be sanitized before and after services.
- Water fountains will be closed or disabled.

Programming

- We are unable to safely offer nursery care. Young children are welcome in the Sanctuary. Those over the age of two should wear a mask.
- Due to the challenges involved in providing a safe Sunday School experience for children, youth, and adults, 10 a.m. classes will not meet.
- A variety of virtual and in-person studies and small group opportunities will be available for all ages at times other than Sunday morning.

Worship is going to look a bit different, but God will still be with us and we will still glorify God together...just a little farther apart than usual!

Hello everyone. Welcome back after whatever break you were able to get this summer. It was certainly a summer unlike those of recent memory, with a lot less traveling and going out for entertainment. Yet, here we are building our new normal.

In a way, we are like Israel during the Exodus longing for the good old days in Egypt when we knew what to expect. Like Israel in the desert, we must trust in God to provide for our needs and lead us to a new land of promise. What will it be like? We will find out when we get there. Things have not been sitting still while we have been mostly away from the church building. We have a new concrete pad and walkway for our new gazebo area. Unfortunately, the parts we got to build the gazebo were from two different kits, so we are having to start over with gazebo construction. We also have a new sidewalk and have replaced half of our parking lot while seal coating the rest, so things are looking better on the outside.

We were also contacted by the Winfield School district to provide food assistance for a family of four, so we have begun that ministry again along with the start of the new school year.

I will continue preaching from the Narrative Lectionary, which starts us off with Genesis and Exodus. So, we will start from the very beginning, which is a very good place to start. I hope that I will see you soon, either in person or virtually in these coming months.
