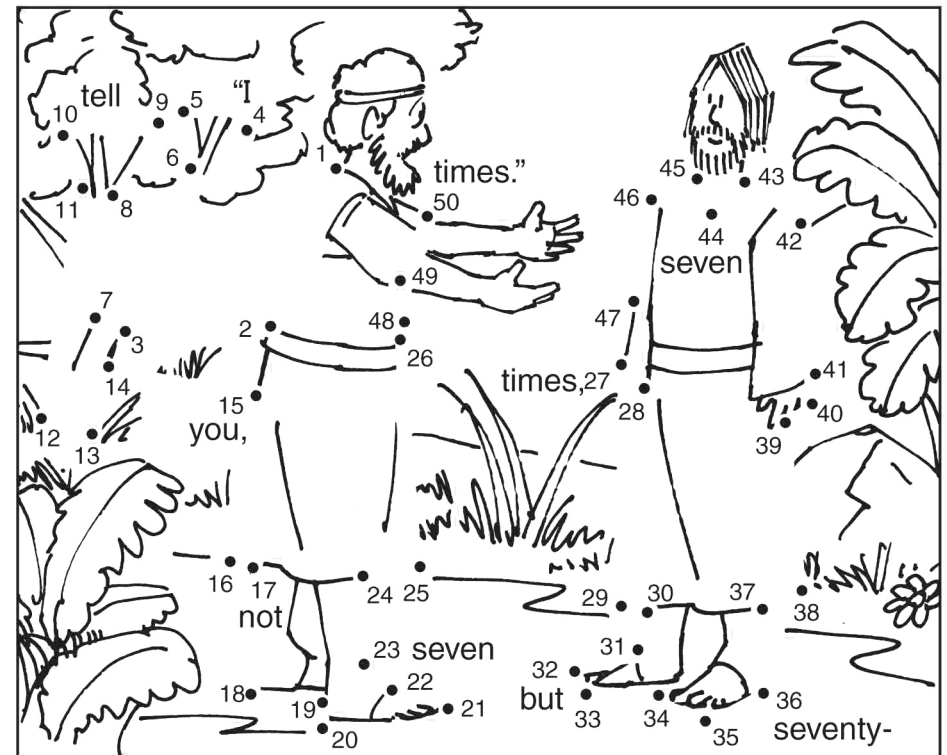

Connect the dots and read the words along the way.



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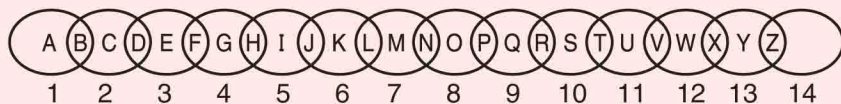

Find 7 “7”s in the picture.



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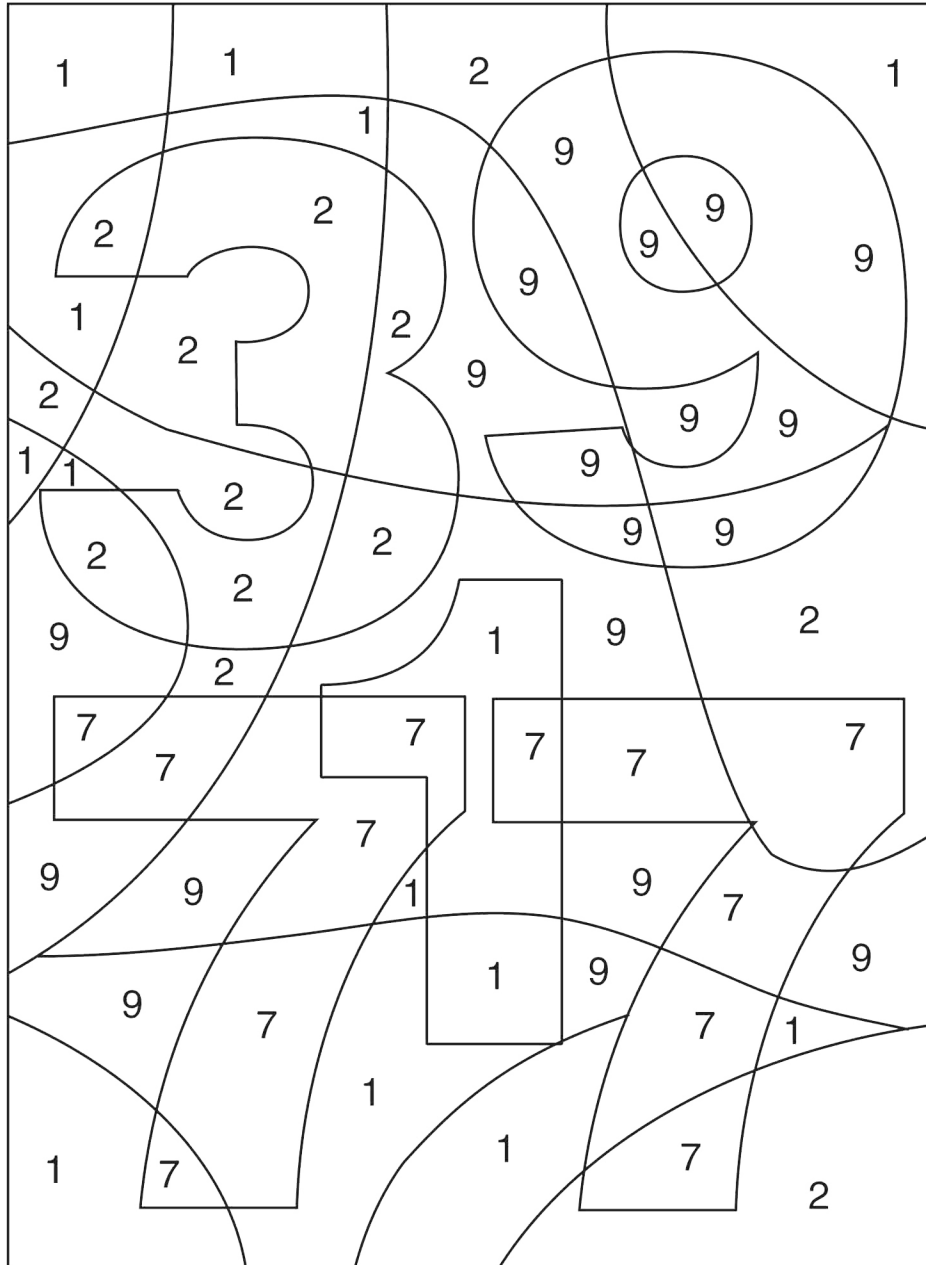
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Jesus replied,
